History: Expected Learning outcomes

First semester

- They can acquire knowledge about pre-historic times, pre-historic man, climatic changes, sedentary life etc.
- Students will learn about the ancient tribes, societies, cultures, religion, polity and economy etc.
- They can also learn about the Vedic times and emergence of new religions like Jainism and Buddhism in ancient India.
- The students will also learn about the empire building under Karkotas and utpalas in Kashmir.

Second semester

- Students will be able to identify the major political developments in India from 12th century A.D to eighteenth century.
- Students will also learn the changes brought under the new political regime in the field of culture, architecture, economy, religion etc.
- They will also learn about the Bhaktism and Sufism and their profound impact on the Indian society.
- The students will come to know about the political developments in Kashmir form 13th century to 16th century in Kashmir. They will acquire knowledge about economy, society, culture, religion, education and politics of this period.

Third semester

- The students will be able to learn the significance of 18th century in political history of India.
- They will learn about the downfall of Mughals, Marathas and emergence of British colonial rule in India.
- They will learn the changes brought under the colonial rule in the Indian society, politics, religion, economy etc.
- They will learn about the reforms and revivalist movements started in India.
- Students will understand the different phases of the freedom struggle from 1857-1947.

Fourth semester

- Students will learn about the different movements, ideas, and revolutions that shaped the modern world.
- They will learn the significance of different words/slogans like individualism, secularism, nationalism, humanism, etc .
- They will also learn the changes which occurred in twentieth century which had resulted into two major wars.

Fifth semester

- Students will learn that the most of the political and economic problems in post independent India are legacies of British rule in India.
- The course also aims to make students understand the post independence challenges to newly elected governments viz., land reforms, linguistic reorganization of states etc.
- The students will learn the changes in Kashmir polity and economy after 1947.
- They will also learn the intricacies of constitutional arrangement between center and Jammu and Kashmir.

Sixth semester

- The students will learn the transformation in Indian society and economy from the pre-historic times to modern times.
- This course will help students in understanding the different professions, continuities and changes.
- In this course students will get nuanced understanding of some of the agrarian ideas and categories presently in vogue. They will also learn the importance of this sector to Indian economy from past times.
- Students will also learn the changes brought under colonial rule in Indian society, polity, economy and religion.
- Students will also understand the reformation and revivalist movements started by educated Indians in response to British criticism of their society and religion.
